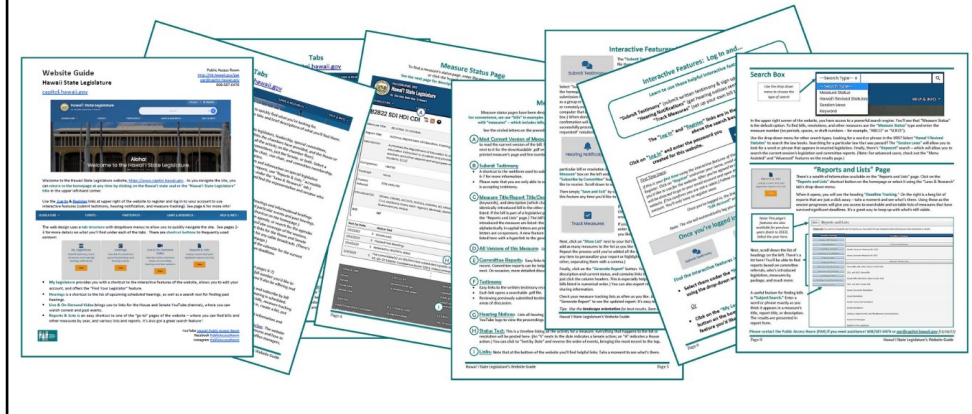

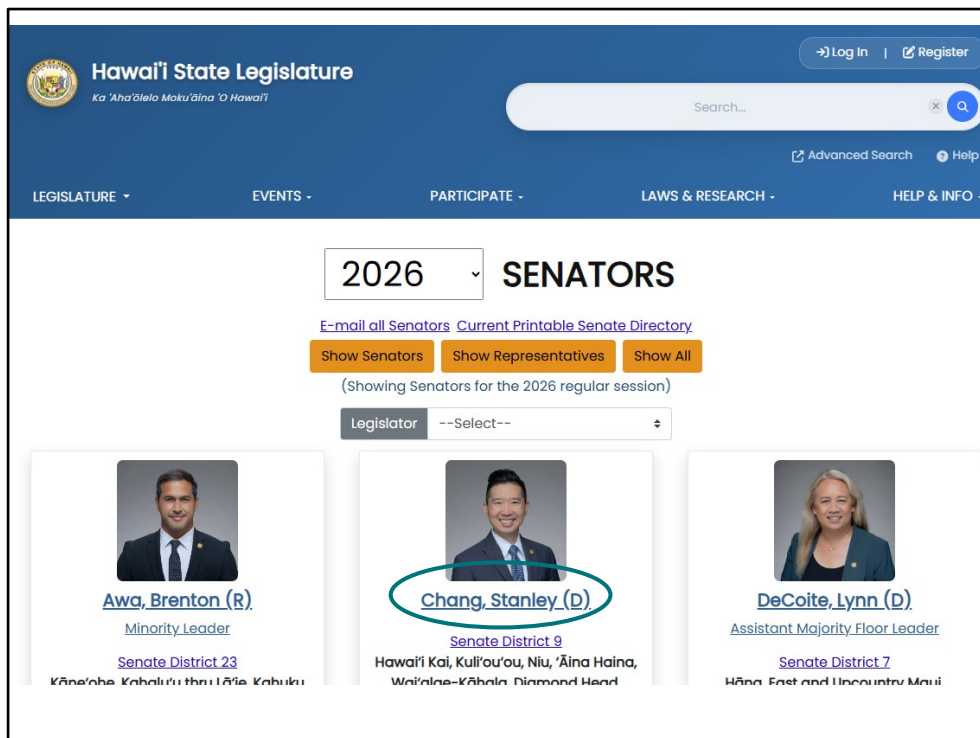
Back up at the top of the homepage, let's see what's available under the "Legislature" tab.

To view the legislators, on the "Legislature" tab and select either House to see information relevant to the House or House Members to view all the Representatives, or Senate to view information relevant to the Senate or Senate Members to view all the Senators.




From the Senate page, you can view leadership information, committees, Senate Rules, and all members by clicking on the tabs you want to view.

If we click on “Senators”...



Here's the page we get when we select "Senators." We can click on their name to get to their own web page.

Note that you can change the Year via a drop down box at the top of the page to see past information.

Stanley Chang represents East Honolulu, Diamond Head to Hawai'i Kai, in the Hawai'i State Senate. A lifelong resident of Wai'ālae-Kāhala, Stanley attended Wai-Kāhala Preschool, Kāhala Elementary School, and Iolani School before attending college and law school at Harvard University. He practiced real estate law at Cades Schutte in Honolulu. Stanley served four years on the Honolulu City Council from 2011 to 2015. In 2016, he was elected to the State Senate as its youngest member, defeating the only Republican member and making the Hawai'i Senate the first legislative chamber in the United States without a minority party since 1983. As chair of the Committee on Housing since 2018, Stanley has pursued an innovative public sector housing

Back on the main Senate page, if you scroll down you'll notice this is also where you can find the Rules and the Journal.

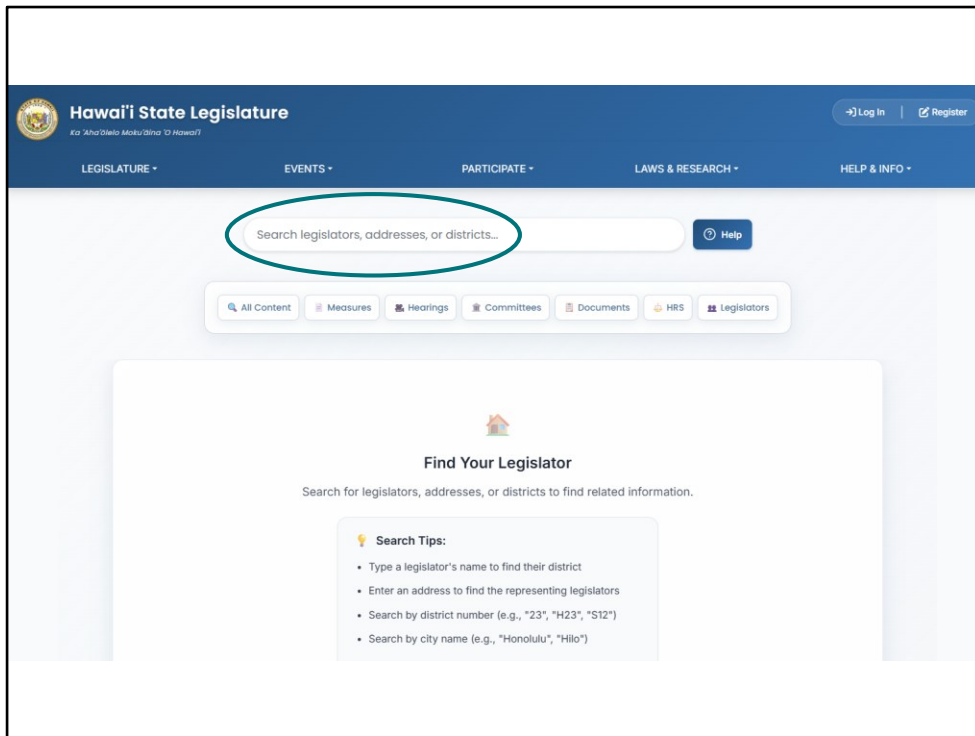
All official announcements, floor debates, and votes during the floor sessions are recorded and published in either the House Journal or Senate Journal. These journals are uploaded to the legislature's website on the respective House and Senate pages and later compiled and published for reference in hard copy form. A mini or advance version of the Journal may be posted until the final version is complete.



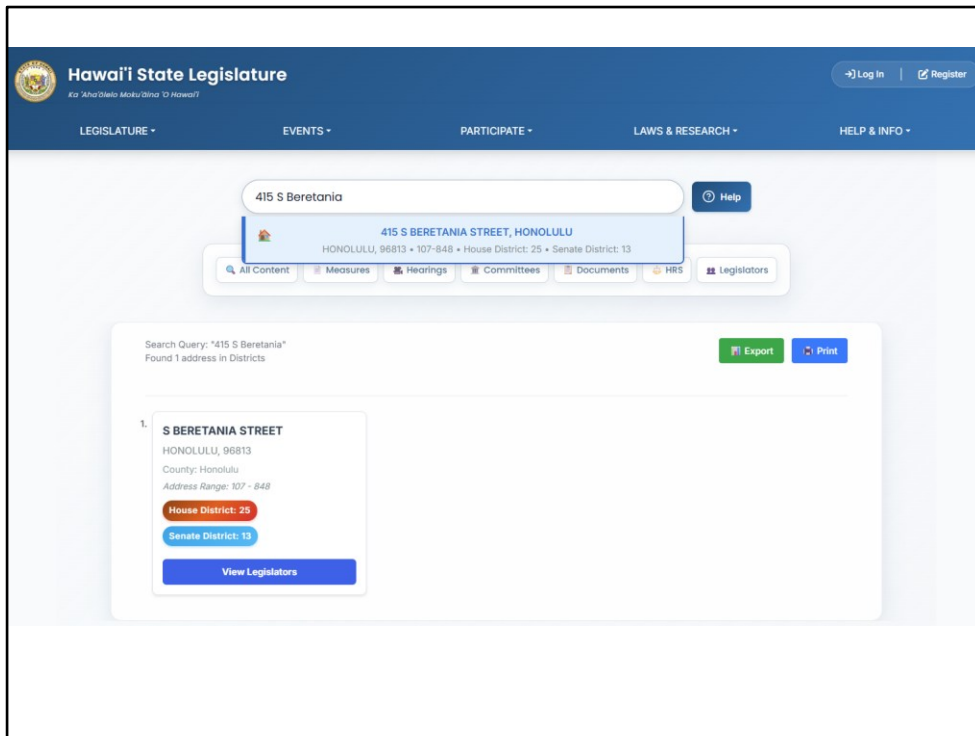
To find out who your own representative and senator are, it's as simple as going to the legislature's website, [capitol.hawaii.gov](http://capitol.hawaii.gov).

From the capitol homepage, click on the "Legislature" tab. Then select "Find your legislator" from the drop-down menu.

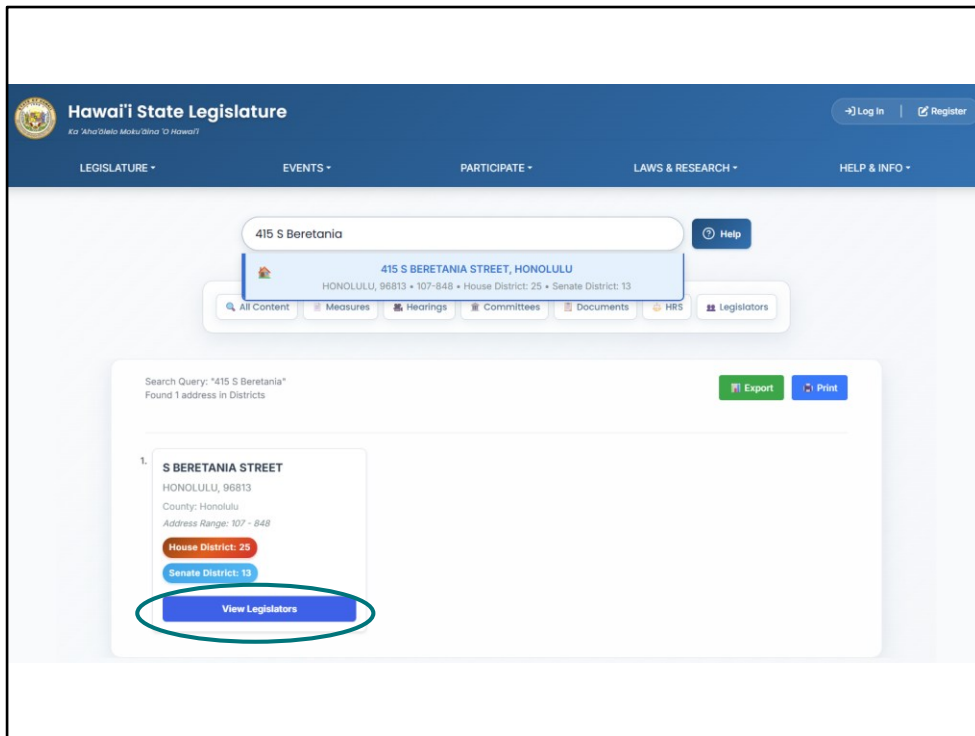




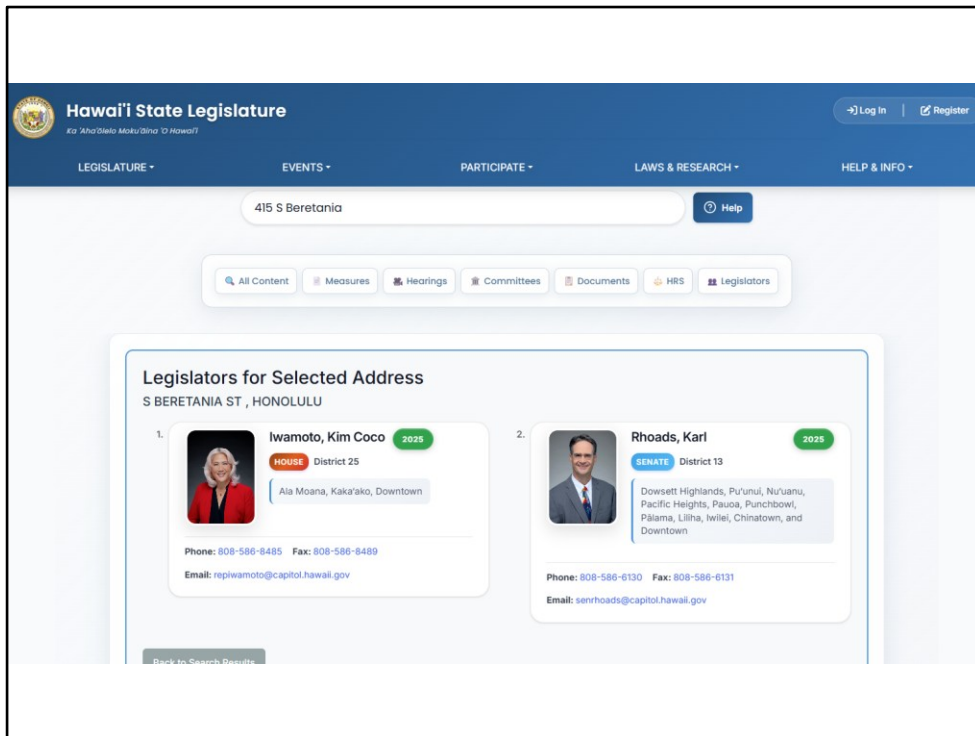
You'll come to this screen where you can type in your address. PAR recommends typing in your specific address rather than city or zip code, as multiple legislators might serve one city or one zip code – district lines may bisect city and zip code, and you want to be sure you contact the correct person for your address.



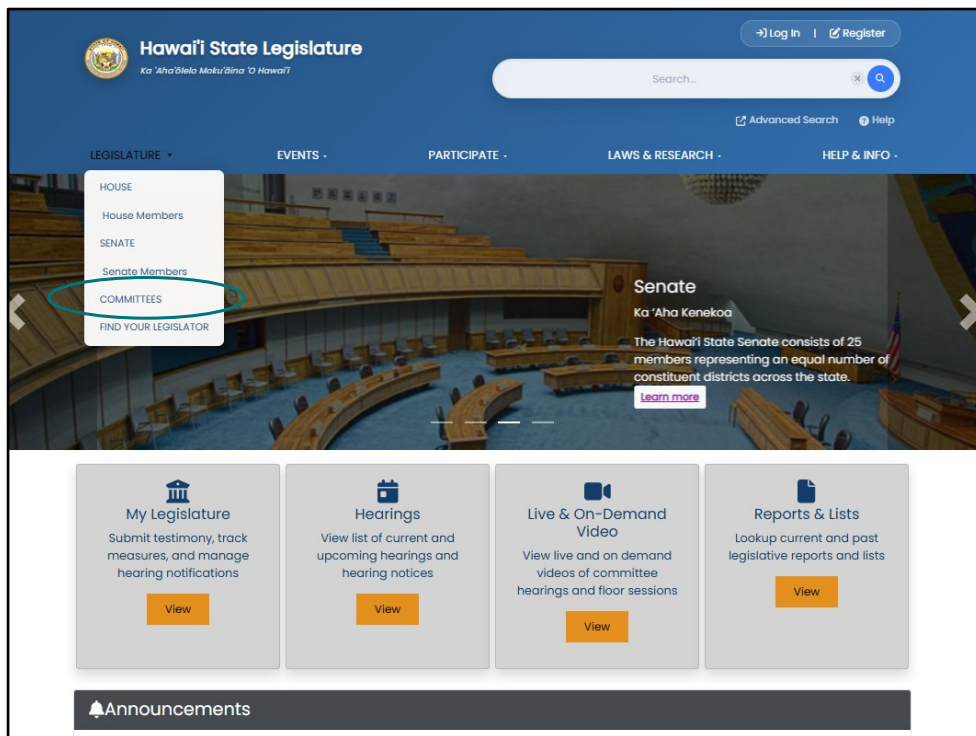
Typing in the address of the state capitol, 415 S. Beretania Street




As soon as we put in the address, the results will display a button to View Legislators for that address. To see who our elected officials are (both House and Senate), just click on “View Legislators” in the box on the left.



When we click on “View Legislators,” we find that our representative would be Rep. Kim Coco Iwamoto and our senator would be Sen. Karl Rhoads, and are provided with their contact information and photos.



Also under the “Legislature” tab is a link to “Committees”

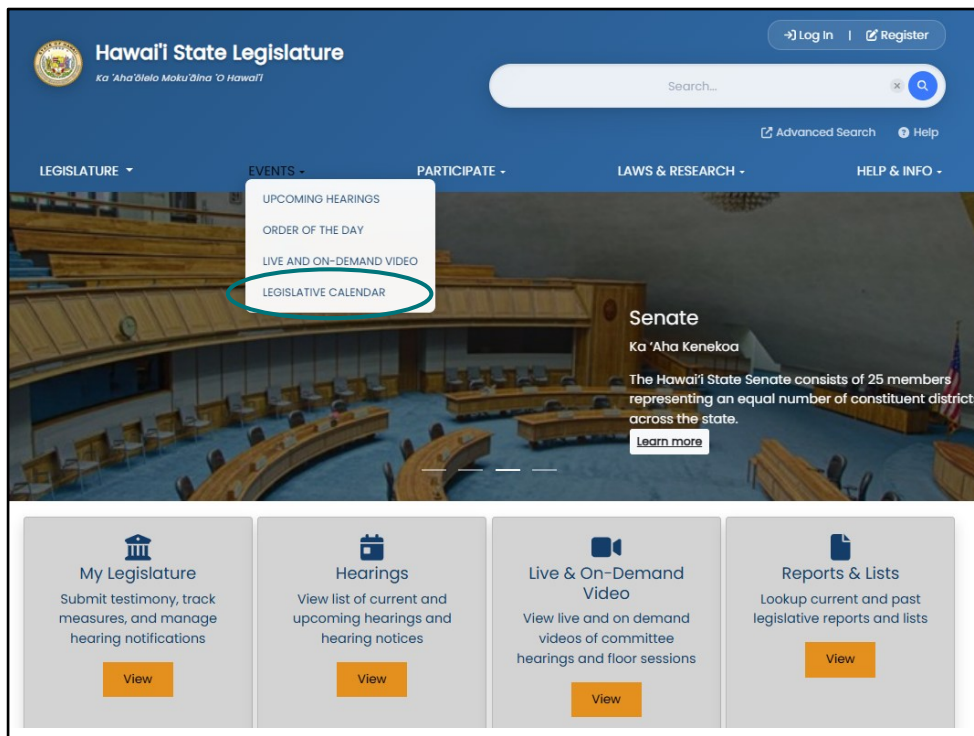

## The 2026 Session Calendar: A Guide to the Deadlines

**JAN 21 OPENING DAY** – Hawaii’s constitution mandates that the regular legislative session starts at 10:00 a.m. on the third Wednesday of January.

**JAN 23 LAST DAY TO INTRODUCE ALL NON-ADMINISTRATION BILL PACKAGES** – Bills bundled together by common interest groups and accepted as a package by the clerks. You can view the various packages of legislation by clicking on the [“Reports and Lists”](#) button on [capitol.hawaii.gov](http://capitol.hawaii.gov).

**& LAST DAY FOR ORGANIZATIONS TO SUBMIT GRANT AND SUBSIDY REQUESTS** – Deadline for “Grant-in-Aid” (GIA) applications. Grants may be appropriated to nonprofit and other organizations for various public purposes that are recognized as priorities and are seen as complying with state government functions. Applications, information, and more specifics regarding the deadline appear under [“Legislative Information”](#) on [capitol.hawaii.gov](http://capitol.hawaii.gov).

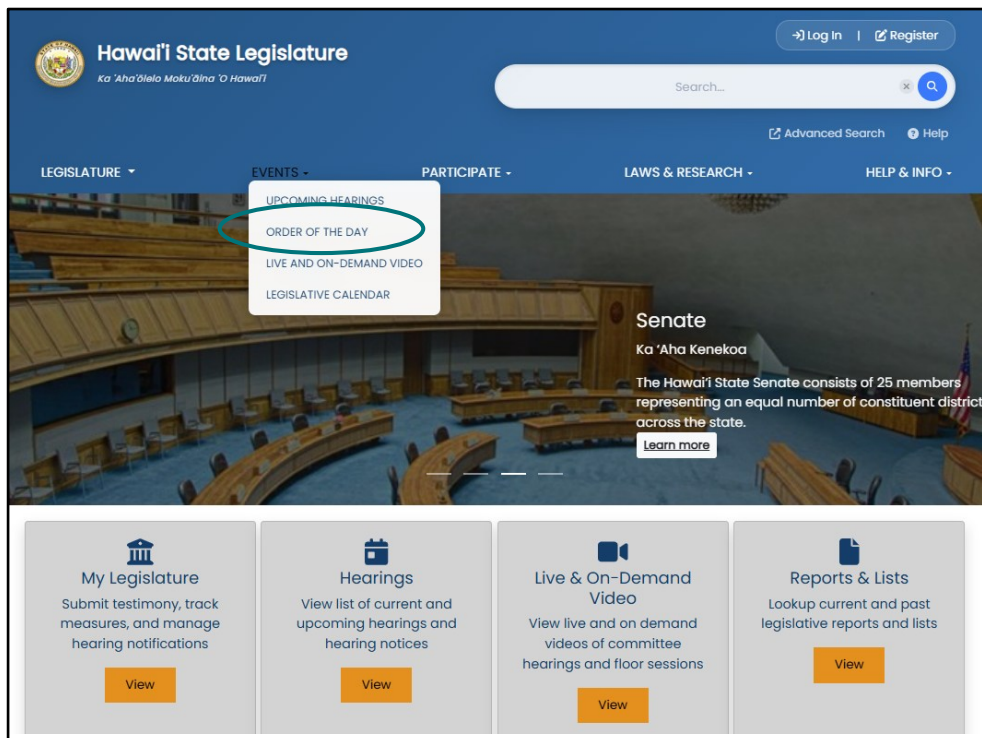

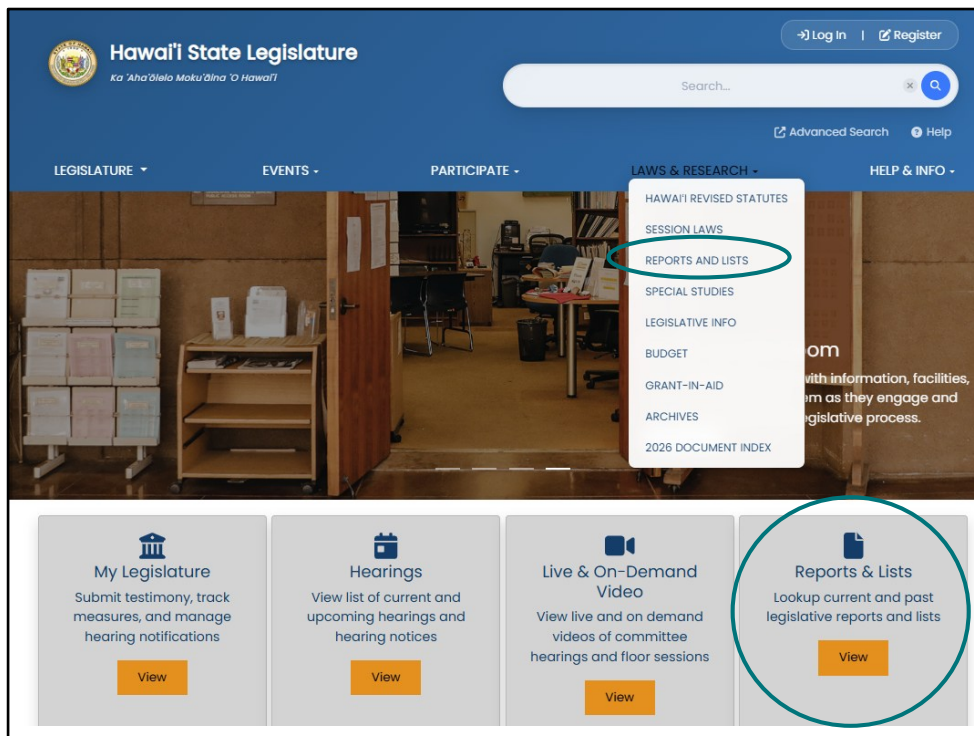
The legislative calendar with the specific dates that will rule our lives during session is published prior to the beginning of a session – typically in December just before session starts.

The calendar is established by the Senate President and the House Speaker, working together.

After clicking on “Reports and Lists,” on the right side of the screen, you will see the heading **“Deadline Tracking.”**

To the right (also under the heading “Deadline Tracking”), you will see a long list of reports that are just a click away. Using these as the session progresses will give you access to sortable and downloadable lists of measures that have survived significant deadlines. It's a great way to keep up with what's still viable.

Here, for example, you can find all the House bills introduced, or later in the session, only the bills that survived first crossover.

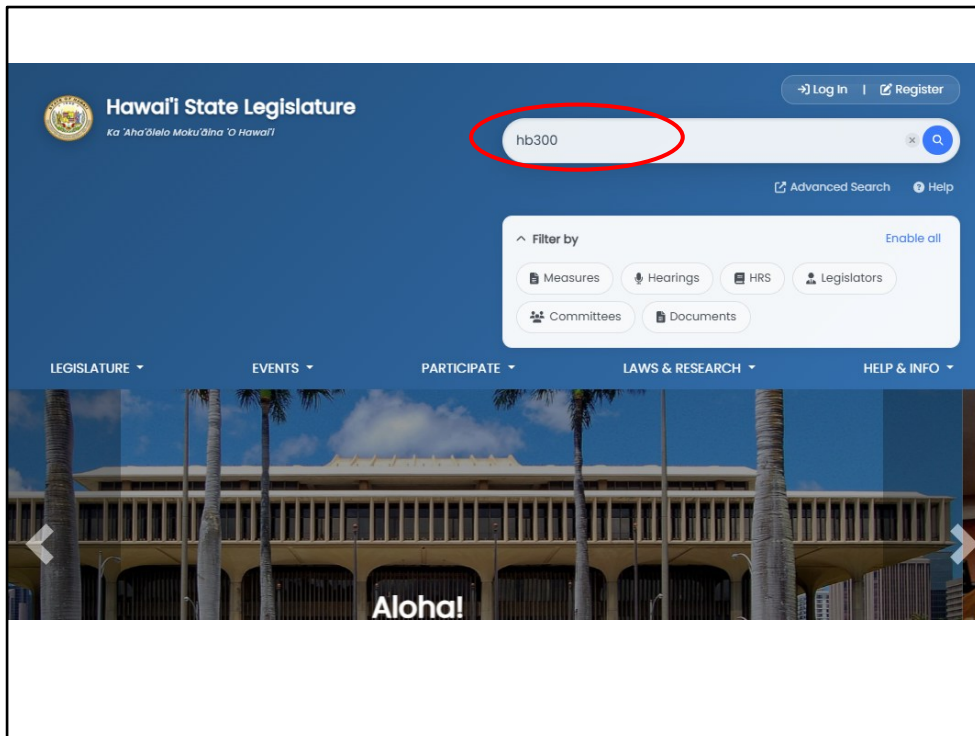

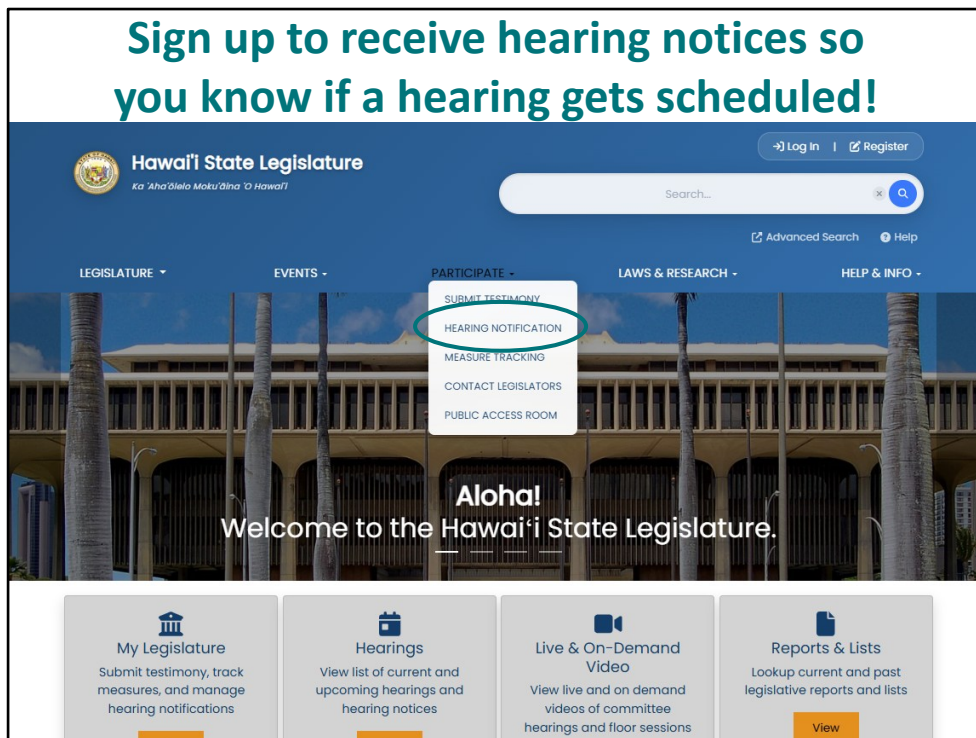

**How the process of posting written testimony works:**

Once your testimony is submitted and is listed in green in the sidebar, it is in our system. However, it is not automatically posted to the website.

**Senate**

- Written testimony submitted by the 24-hour deadline will be posted online prior to the convening of the public hearing.
- Written testimony received after the 24-hour deadline will be posted to the Capitol website within 24 hours after the hearing has adjourned and may be marked as "late".

**House**

- The hearing committee gathers all "on-time" testimony in the system for a particular bill, which is testimony submitted at least 24 hours before the hearing, and compiles it into a single document. Staff will try to incorporate additional testimony received within 24 hours of the hearing if possible.
- The hearing committee will post testimony received "on-time" to the Capitol website at the beginning of the hearing.
- Testimony received after the 24-hour deadline may be marked as "late" but will be posted to the Capitol website as soon as possible following the hearing. Testimony submitted after the hearing will not be considered or posted.

Your testimony was submitted and should appear in the list to the left. You will no longer receive email confirmation of testimony. If it is listed in green, then it was successfully received by our system.

You'll be returned to the original "Submit Testimony" page. A green box on the left corresponding to your hearing will appear, along with the word "Submitted" as the status. This indicates that your written testimony has been successfully transmitted to the committee.

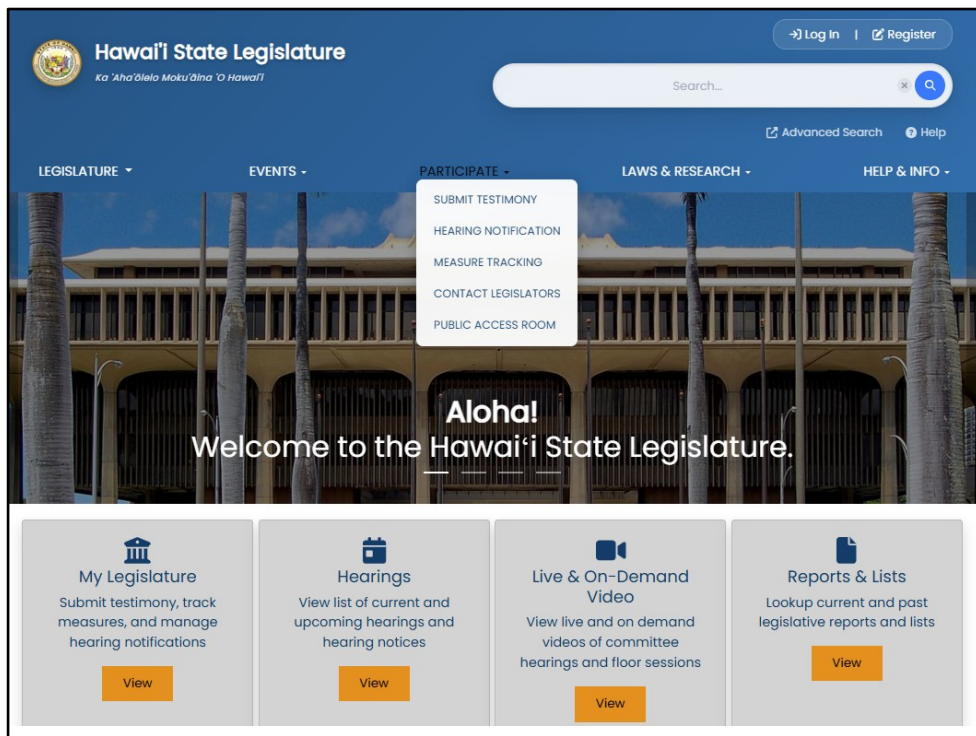
## So, if you're Zooming... when hearing time rolls around...

- Your microphone should be muted, and your video stopped, unless it is your turn to testify.
- You will receive a request to share your video shortly before it is your turn. Accept the request.
- When the Chair calls on you, unmute your microphone and then begin addressing the committee.
- If you do not respond when the Chair calls on you, you may miss your chance to testify.

We are **non-partisan**, dealing exclusively in **process** and never in **policy** considerations. There is never a fee for our services – we’re supported by your tax dollars. You can come to PAR to use one of the public computers or the printer, have a small meeting, get copies of your testimony, or watch a hearing remotely. We have tables for you to work on your laptop (there’s free wifi throughout the building) or recharge your devices. Or perhaps just sit and relax a while. We can answer your questions and point you to resources. We also offer workshops and tutorials so you can learn more.

Our office is one of the five divisions of the (also non-partisan) Legislative Reference Bureau (LRB), a legislative service agency. A brief overview of the other divisions of the LRB:

- **LRB Library** has extensive holdings that cover legislative matters, some of which date all the way back to the days of the Kingdom. The research librarians can be very helpful and are a resource available to the public. They’re located in the Chamber level of the Capitol in Room 005 and can be reached at 808/587-0690.
- The Research Division is one of five drafting agencies in the Capitol; they are available to assist any of the 76 legislators. The staff provides research, drafts legislation and committee reports, and publishes specific studies as requested by the legislature.
- The Statute Revision Division integrates the newly-passed Acts into the fourteen volumes of the Hawaii Revised Statutes (the HRS), the codified book of laws governing the state of Hawaii.
- The Information Systems Offices maintains a data base of relevant legislative information for internal legislative use. The staff also provide technical support for the division.
