## FOREWORD

This publication sets forth all of the requests made by the Hawaii State Legislature during the Regular Session of 2020 to agencies and officials of the federal, state and county governments and of quasi-public and private agencies. These requests are contained in acts enacted by the Legislature or bills passed, but which have yet to be approved by the Governor. These acts or bills include specific requests for submission of information back to the Legislature, excluding annual and other reports requested on an indefinite basis. These requests are also contained in resolutions adopted by the Senate or House of Representatives or by both bodies of the Legislature. Dates by which reports and other responses are expected are indicated when specifically set by the Legislature. The names of the agencies involved in the conduct of a study or the execution of a request are underscored.

For the reader's convenience these legislative requests are also grouped together by agencies (see agency index); as well as by subject matter (see subject index).

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PART III, SECTION 7.1

**INMATES RELEASED PURSUANT TO SUPREME COURT ORDERS.** Requires the judiciary, beginning on the effective date of this Act, to submit a weekly report to the Legislature that includes the following information for all inmates released pursuant to supreme court orders entered in SCPW-20-0000200 and SCPW-20-0000213:

- (1) The inmate's name;
- (2) The inmate's release date;
- (3) The correctional center or facility where the inmate was released from;
- (4) The inmate's criminal status before release, for example felony probationer, misdemeanor, or petty misdemeanor;
- (5) Any objections made to the inmate's release;
- (6) The inmate's verified residence address at the time of release;
- (7) The inmate's current verified residence address or homeless status;
- (8) The conditions of supervised release;
- (9) The name of the person or agency that is responsible for supervising the inmate upon release; and
- (10) If a released inmate is subsequently arrested, the inmate's arrest record following release.

Requires the information provided pursuant to this provision to be updated in each subsequent report to reflect the inmate's current status, including any changes to paragraph (7) and (10).

PART II, SECTION 5

**HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (BED150), MAUI REGIONAL PUBLIC SAFETY COMPLEX AT PULEHUNUI (Item no. I-3.1), IMPLEMENTATION OF PLANNING FOR.** Provides that with the approval of the governor, the department of public safety may delegate responsibility and transfer funds to the Hawaii community development authority (BED150) for the implementation of planning for the Maui regional public safety complex at Pulehunui (Item no. I-3.1), when it is determined by the agencies that it is advantageous to do so; provided further that the Hawaii community development authority shall submit to the Legislature a summary report of all uses of this authority for the previous twelve month period from December 1 to November 30 no later than thirty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021.

PART I, SECTION 2

**CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT (CARES ACT), COVID-19 RESPONSE, APPROPRIATION.** Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, response conducted pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that any COVID-19 related law enforcement activities are conducted in consultation with the attorney general; provided further that beginning June

1, 2020, a monthly report shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of defense for the purposes of this section.

#### PART I, SECTION 3

CARES ACT, PANDEMIC UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for the pandemic unemployment assistance program pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that beginning June 1, 2020, a monthly report shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this section.

#### PART I, SECTION 4

CARES ACT, INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, SYSTEMS, AND STAFFING, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for information technology, systems, and staffing pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that beginning June 1, 2020, a monthly report shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this section.

#### PART I, SECTION 5

CARES ACT, FEDERAL FUNDS, FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS. Authorizes the following positions to be funded by federal funds received pursuant to Public Law 116-136 by the department of labor and industrial relations:

- (1) Three full-time equivalent (3.0 FTE) hearings officers;
- (2) Thirty full-time equivalent (30.0 FTE) claims assistants; and
- (3) Nine full-time equivalent (9.0 FTE) auditors;

provided that beginning June 1, 2020, a monthly report shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature on the status of these positions.

#### PART I, SECTION 6

CARES ACT, INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND OTHER SYSTEMS, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for information technology and other systems pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that beginning June 1, 2020, a monthly report shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of human services for the purposes of this section.

#### PART II, SECTION 8

CARES ACT, COVID-19 RESPONSE, COUNTY OF HAWAII, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, response conducted pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate agencies; provided that:

- (1) The county of Hawaii shall coordinate with the department of health and appropriate medical and nursing professionals when implementing contact tracing and testing programs;
- (2) The mayor of the county of Hawaii shall consult with the Hawaii county council before expending any of the funds appropriated by this section; and
- (3) Beginning June 1, 2020, the county of Hawaii shall submit a monthly report to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of Hawaii for the purposes of this section.

#### PART II, SECTION 9

CARES ACT, COVID-19 RESPONSE, COUNTY OF MAUI, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, response conducted pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate agencies; provided that:

- (1) The county of Maui shall coordinate with the department of health and appropriate medical and nursing professionals when implementing contact tracing and testing programs;
- (2) The mayor of the county of Maui shall consult with the Maui county council before expending any of the funds appropriated by this section; and
- (3) Beginning June 1, 2020, the county of Maui shall submit a monthly report to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of Maui for the purposes of this section.

#### PART II, SECTION 10

CARES ACT, COVID-19 RESPONSE, COUNTY OF KAUAI, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, response conducted pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate agencies; provided that:

- (1) The county of Kauai shall coordinate with the department of health and appropriate medical and nursing professionals when implementing contact tracing and testing programs;
- (2) The mayor of the county of Kauai shall consult with the Kauai county council before expending any of the funds appropriated by this section; and
- (3) Beginning June 1, 2020, the county of Kauai shall submit a monthly report to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the county of Kauai for the purposes of this section.

PART III, SECTION 13

PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM AND HEALTH CARE ENHANCEMENT ACT, THERMAL SCREENING PROGRAMS, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act, Public Law 116-139, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for thermal screening programs pursuant to Public Law 116-139 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that beginning June 1, 2020, a monthly report shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of transportation for the purposes of this section.

(PART III, SECTION 13 repealed by ACT 9, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, SB 126, SD1, HD1, CD1)

PART III, SECTION 14

PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM AND HEALTH CARE ENHANCEMENT ACT, OUTBREAK CONTROL, CONTACT TRACING PROGRAMS, AND PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the funds received by the State of Hawaii from the Paycheck Protection Program and Health Care Enhancement Act, Public Law 116-139, for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used for outbreak control, contact tracing programs, and personal protective equipment, pursuant to Public Law 116-139 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that beginning June 1, 2020, a monthly report shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature that details all allocations and expenditures.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of health for the purposes of this section.

**ACT 9**

**SB 126, SD1, HD1, CD1**

PART II, SECTION 44.2

GOVERNOR, TRANSFER OPERATING FUNDS. Provides that any law or provision of this Act to the contrary notwithstanding, the governor is authorized to transfer operating funds between general fund appropriations of departments to address critical program requirements; provided that the governor shall submit a report to the Legislature within ten days of each use of this provision

PART II, SECTION 44.4

GOVERNOR, USE SAVINGS AS DETERMINED TO BE AVAILABLE FROM FEDERAL FUNDS. Provides that if unanticipated state funding cutbacks diminish or curtail essential, generally funded positions, the governor may utilize savings as determined to be available from federal funds for the purpose of maintaining those positions until the next legislative session; provided that each department shall submit a report to the Legislature and the department of budget and finance within five days of each use of this authority.

PART XI, SECTION 24

HOUSING RELIEF AND RESILIENCY PROGRAM. Establishes within the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation the housing relief and resiliency program that is intended to be a flexible

program that meets the needs of households that have been economically impacted by COVID-19 and are facing housing hardships.

Requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to select and contract with a nonprofit intermediary who shall establish a centralized database and work with community nonprofit agencies, such as community development financial institutions and housing counseling agencies, to distribute funds and provide other assistance to qualified households.

Requires the program to:

- (1) Target renters and homeowners who have experienced a reduction in income because of unemployment or reduction in work hours due to COVID-19; and
- (2) Provide help with rental payments for impacted renter households and counseling and loan modification assistance for impacted homeowner households.

Requires housing assistance to be provided on a first-come, first-served basis until funds are depleted. Requires the housing relief assistance payment period to be from August 1, 2020, to December 28, 2020.

Requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to submit a report to the Legislature describing the outcomes of the housing relief and resiliency program no later than January 20, 2021.

#### PART XI, SECTION 25

CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT (CARES ACT), HOUSING AND RENTAL ASSISTANCE AND THE ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS RELATED TO THE HOUSING RELIEF AND RESILIENCY PROGRAM, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used for housing and rental assistance and the administrative costs related to the housing relief and resiliency program, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) The funds shall be geographically allocated for housing relief payments to the city and county of Honolulu; county of Hawaii; county of Maui; county of Kauai; and for use statewide;
- (2) The funds may be allocated for the cost of administering the program, including administrative and monitoring expenses incurred by the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation and the nonprofit intermediary recipient;
- (3) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (4) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (5) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of this part.

(Governor line item veto, Governor's Message 1112; although Governor's Message 1112 noted that '\$100,000,000' was to be line item vetoed and replaced with '\$50,000,000', no such line item veto appeared in the returned bill as of August 18, 2020)

## PART XII, SECTION 29

CARES ACT, SUPPORT CHILD CARE PROVIDERS, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used to support child care providers, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; provided that each report shall include the following information by county:
  - (A) The total number and dollar amount of grants awarded;
  - (B) The total number and dollar amount of grants awarded to:
    - (i) Licensed child care facilities;
    - (ii) Family child care homes;
    - (iii) Group child care centers;
    - (iv) Group child care homes; and
    - (v) Eligible exempt child care facilities; and
  - (C) The total child care maximum capacity at child care facilities receiving the grant awarded funds; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of human services for the purposes of this part.

## PART XIII, SECTION 30

CARES ACT, PURCHASE AND DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT TO HOSPITALS, CHILDCARE FACILITIES, ELDERLY CARE FACILITIES, BUSINESSES, NON-PROFITS, AND SCHOOLS, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used for the purchase and distribution of personal protective equipment to hospitals, childcare facilities, elderly care facilities, businesses, non-profits, and schools, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of defense for the purposes of this part.

(Governor line item veto, Governor's Message 1112)

PART XIV, SECTION 31

CARES ACT, AIRPORT SCREENING AND HEALTH ASSURANCE SECURITY INITIATIVES, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used for airport screening and health assurance security initiatives, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of transportation for the purposes of this part.

(Governor line item veto, Governor's Message 1112)

PART XV, SECTION 32

CARES ACT, RETRAINING AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used for retraining and workforce development programs, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the business development and support division (BED100) of the department of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of this part.

(Governor line item veto, Governor's Message 1112)

PART XVI, SECTION 33

CARES ACT, INNOVATION GRANTS TO SUPPORT EMERGING INDUSTRIES TO CREATE A SUPPLY CHAIN FOR CLEANING SUPPLIES AND PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the

CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used as innovation grants to support emerging industries to create a supply chain for cleaning supplies and personal protective equipment, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) Grant awards shall be limited to no more than \$500,000 per recipient, unless additional funding need is determined by the Hawaii technology development corporation;
- (2) Grant awards shall be made to recipients with less than fifty employees;
- (3) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (4) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (5) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii technology development corporation (BED143) of the department of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of this part.

(Governor line item veto, Governor's Message 1112)

#### PART XVII, SECTION 34

CARES ACT, PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP TO PROVIDE FOOD ASSISTANCE TO FAMILIES IN NEED, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used for a public-private partnership to provide food assistance to families in need, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of community services (LBR903) of the department of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this part.

#### PART XVIII, SECTION 35

CARES ACT, SUPPORT THE COMMERCIAL FISHING INDUSTRY, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used to support the commercial fishing industry, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;

- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the business development and support division (BED100) of the department of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of this part.

#### PART XIX, SECTION 36

CARES ACT, PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP TO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS WHO WERE ADVERSELY AFFECTED BY SCHOOL CLOSURES IN THEIR FINAL SEMESTER OF SCHOOL, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used for a public-private partnership to provide support to public high school seniors who were adversely affected by school closures in their final semester of school, pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of community services (LBR903) of the department of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this part.

(Governor line item veto, Governor's Message 1112)

#### PART XX, SECTION 37

CARES ACT, ELIGIBLE PROGRAMS, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used for eligible programs pursuant to Public Law 116-136 and associated guidance issued by appropriate federal agencies; provided that:

- (1) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- (2) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature; and
- (3) On December 28, 2020, any unexpended funds shall be transferred to the unemployment compensation trust fund established under section 383-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the governor for the purposes of this part.

PART XXI, SECTION 38

CARES ACT, ADDITIONAL WEEKLY UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFIT OF \$100 PER WEEK TO STATE ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS, APPROPRIATION. Appropriates out of the emergency and budget reserve fund established under section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, from the amounts received by the State of Hawaii from the CARES Act, Public Law 116-136, for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be used between August 1, 2020, and December 30, 2020, to provide an additional weekly unemployment benefit of \$100 per week to state eligible recipients; provided that:

- (1) No additional \$100 weekly unemployment benefit shall be issued if there exists an additional federal unemployment benefit of more than \$300 per week;
- (2) The department of labor and industrial relations shall have flexibility in the implementation of this part;
- (3) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and
- (4) Beginning July 15, 2020, a monthly report that details all allocations and expenditures shall be submitted to the governor and the Legislature.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this part.

**SB 2638, SD2, HD3**

ABUSE OF FAMILY OR HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS, PENALTY. Requires the judiciary to submit a report to the Legislature no later than forty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2022, 2023, 2024, 2025, and 2026 that includes, for cases filed with the judiciary involving offenses under section 709-906, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the outcome of each case, including the number of cases dismissed, by category; the number found not guilty; the number found guilty; and other outcomes, by category; provided that in cases in which an offender was required to complete a domestic violence intervention programs or parenting classes, the report shall include, by category, the number of cases in which the program was completed or not completed and the consequences for failure to complete the program.

**SB 3103, SD2, HD2**

SCHOOL FACILITIES AGENCY, ESTABLISHED, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. Provides that if all or any portion of any salary of the executive director or any officer, agent, or employee of the school facilities agency is funded pursuant to this provision, the school facilities agency shall submit a report to the Legislature detailing the use of any funds authorized under this provision no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the next regular session following the expenditure authorization.

Requires the school facilities agency to submit to the director of finance a report that shall be prepared in the form prescribed by the director of finance and shall identify the total amount of funds in the school facilities special fund that will carry over to the next fiscal year. Requires the school facilities agency to submit the report to the director of finance within ninety days of the close of each

fiscal year and a copy of the information contained in the report to the director of finance shall be included within the agency's report to the Legislature pursuant to section 302A-G, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

Provides that at least twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session, the school facilities agency shall submit to the governor, board of education, and Legislature, a complete and detailed report of its activities during the prior fiscal year.

Requires the school facilities agency to collaborate with the department of education and submit a report to the Legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021, identifying positions of the department of education that should be transferred to the school facilities agency established by section 1 of this Act, including positions responsible for public school development, planning, and construction related to capital improvement projects, along with proposed legislation to further implement the transfer of positions and related records and equipment to effectuate the purpose of this Act.

### **SB 3117, SD1, HD2**

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT HOMELESSNESS ASSESSMENT PILOT PROGRAM, MEDICAL RESPITE PILOT PROGRAM. Amends Act 209, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, relating to homelessness.

Requires the department of human services to work with the participating hospital under the emergency department homelessness assessment pilot program to collect and analyze data to be included in a report that contains a summary and explanation of the data regarding the efficacy of emergency department intervention by the multidisciplinary team in mitigating the number of unnecessary emergency department visits by patients experiencing homelessness or patients at risk of experiencing homelessness. Requires the report to contain findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, for continuation, modification, or termination of the pilot program. Requires the department of human services to submit the report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2020 and 2021.

Requires the emergency department homelessness assessment pilot program to cease to exist on June 30, 2021.

Requires the department of human services to submit a report to the Legislature of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, regarding the medical respite pilot program no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2020 and 2021.

Requires the medical respite pilot program to cease to exist on June 30, 2021.

### **HB 1620, HD2, SD2**

ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE, FITNESS TO PROCEED, PENAL RESPONSIBILITY, MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT. Requires the judiciary, in consultation with the prosecuting attorney of each county, to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, on the effectiveness of this Act (Relating to the administration of justice) to the Legislature no later than forty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2021, 2022, and 2023.

**HB 1676, HD1, SD2**

PHOTO RED LIGHT IMAGING DETECTOR SYSTEM PILOT PROGRAM. Establishes the photo red light imaging detector systems pilot program to enforce the traffic-control signal laws of the State, which may be implemented by the city and county of Honolulu, in the major arterial zones on state or county highways, within that area in the city and county of Honolulu established as Honolulu Police Department Districts 1, 5, 6 and 7, as they existed on July 1, 2020.

Requires the department of transportation, in consultation with any county that implements a photo red light imaging detector system pilot program pursuant to this Act, to annually submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024.

Requires the reports to include, at a minimum, information on whether the implementation of the pilot program has resulted in any statistically significant reduction in motor vehicle collisions, traffic infractions, and other traffic-related incidents. Requires the reports to also include recommendations on how to improve the pilot program, if it should be made permanent, and funding estimates.

Requires the pilot project to operate for a minimum of two years, starting from the time the cameras become operational and summons or citations are first issued.

AUTONOMOUS VEHICLES TESTING PILOT PROGRAM. Establishes the autonomous vehicles testing pilot program within the department of transportation.

Requires the department of transportation to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, regarding the autonomous vehicles testing pilot program to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023.

Requires the report to include:

- (1) A recommendation of whether autonomous vehicles are ready to be fully deployed in Hawaii; and
- (2) Issues surrounding the feasibility and safety of the operation of autonomous vehicles on Hawaii's roads, as well as other matters deemed relevant by the department of transportation.

NATIVE HAWAIIAN HOUSING BLOCK GRANTS, FEDERAL FUNDS FOR. Strongly urges the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Congress of the United States to:

- (1) Provide additional federal funds for Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grants under the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act; and
- (2) Identify and secure other forms of direct assistance to the State of Hawaii to address the affordable housing needs of the Native Hawaiian population.

Urges the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to assist and train individual Hawaiian homesteads on the technical aspects and processes involved in expending and utilizing Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grants.

#### **SR 11**

POST-PARTUM WOMEN, EXPANSION OF MED-QUEST COVERAGE TO. Requests the Department of Human Services to provide an estimate of the budget appropriation and legislative action necessary to fund an expansion of Med-QUEST coverage to all otherwise eligible post-partum women in the State for a period of twelve months following childbirth.

Requests the Department of Human Services to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021.

PATIENTS WITH LIFE THREATENING CONDITIONS WHO ARE ENROLLED IN CLINICAL TRIALS, MEDICAID COVERAGE. Urges Congress to pass the Clinical Treatment Act to amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to require Medicaid to cover the routine costs of care for patients with life threatening conditions who are enrolled in clinical trials.

Requests the Governor to recognize and commemorate August 26, 2020, as Women's Equality Day, celebrating the centennial of, and honoring Hawaii's role in, the Women's Suffrage Movement, thus reaffirming its commitment to empowering and uplifting the voices of women across our great State.

GORSE, MITIGATION PLAN TO ADDRESS THE SPREAD AND ERADICATION OF, HAWAII ISLAND. Urges the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to convene a task force with the Department of Land and Natural Resources, Department of Agriculture, Invasive Species Council, and other interested parties to develop a comprehensive mitigation plan with short and long term solutions to address the spread and eradication of gorse on Hawaii island.

Resolves that the task force will leverage all county, state, and federal agencies to address the problem and explore potential commercial opportunities, such as the use in biofuel, feedstock, and oils that would help address the issue.

- (5) As payment for executive bonuses; any advertising or marketing, except customer and employee communications; club or membership dues; charitable or political contributions; non-essential business travel; seminars, conferences, or conventions; entertainment expenses; or any other non-operating expenses.

Requests that on or before August 1, 2020, the Public Utilities Commission, in collaboration with the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs' Division of Consumer Advocacy and any interisland water carriers operating in the State, to convene a working group to recommend mid-term and long-term solutions to balance the need for continuous interisland water carrier service throughout the State with the need for water carriers to maintain financial sustainability.

- (5) Notify beneficiaries through beneficiary consultation of any interest or other earnings that may be credited to and deposited into the Hawaiian Home Operating Fund or Hawaiian Home Receipts Fund;
- (6) Provide quarterly reports to the Legislature and beneficiaries that includes data on the inventory of formerly leased properties and disposition status of homestead properties and improvements under the control of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands;

- (7) Post and maintain the listing of the formerly leased properties on the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands' website and conduct auctions of properties to the waitlist at least twice per year; and
- (8) Negotiate with homestead association governed water agencies to maintain water systems, including water billing, prior to other service providers.

Requests the Hawaiian Homes Commission to submit a report of its findings and recommendations regarding its efforts to improve beneficiary access to Hawaiian home lands and other trust assets, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021.

#### **SR 166, SD1**

EXECUTIVE BRANCH DEPARTMENTS AND ATTACHED AGENCIES, INFORM LEGISLATURE WHEN IMPLEMENTING THEIR COVID-19 PANDEMIC PLANS AND PROCEDURES. Requests all executive branch departments and attached agencies to inform the Senate and House of Representatives when implementing their plans and procedures relating to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Requests all state departments and attached agencies to inform the President of the Senate and members of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives and members of the House of Representatives when adjusting or deviating from normal operating procedures, such as reduced hours, telecommuting, or cancellation of public meetings.

Requests all state departments and attached agencies to communicate all new procedures being implemented and include the start and end dates of the new procedures.

#### **SR 174, SD1**

ADVANCE TRAVEL QUARANTINE AND STATEWIDE STAY-AT-HOME ORDERS, ESTABLISHMENT OF, CORONAVIRUS DISEASE RESURGENCE IN HAWAII. Requests the Governor to establish advance travel quarantine and statewide stay-at-home orders to ensure rapid and effective response to any future resurgence of COVID-19 in the State.

Requests any mandatory travel quarantine order to include a requirement that any traveler who is unwilling or unable to comply with the order be subject to mandatory imprisonment or immediate transport back to the traveler's last departure location at the traveler's expense.

Requests any travel quarantine order to include both civil and criminal penalties for any person found to be in violation of the order.

Requests any travel quarantine order drafted pursuant to this Resolution to include both civil and criminal penalties for any person found guilty of aiding another in violating a travel quarantine order.

Requests any statewide stay-at-home order to also include both civil and criminal penalties for any person found to be in violation of the statewide stay-at-home order.

WATER LEASES, HAWAIIAN ELECTRIC'S NON-CONSUMPTIVE USE, WAILUKU RIVER, HAWAII ISLAND. Urges the Board of Land and Natural Resources to expedite the disposition of the long-term water leases for Hawaiian Electric's non-consumptive use along the Wailuku River.

Urges the Board of Land and Natural Resources to base the lease rent on the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission charges calculated by the amount of energy produced by the hydroelectric generating plant.

**SR 198, SD1**

SENATE SPECIAL INVESTIGATING COMMITTEE ON COVID-19. Establishes the Senate Special Investigating Committee on COVID-19, pursuant to chapter 21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and Rules 13 and 25 of the Rules of the Senate, and may operate during the 2020 interim to:

- (1) Assess and advise the Senate regarding the State of Hawaii's COVID-19 plans and procedures;
- (2) Confirm the development of state and county departmental plans and procedures;
- (3) Review and assess current state and county departmental plans and procedures;
- (4) Review and assess whether state and county departmental plans and procedures are properly and timely implemented to safeguard public health and safety;
- (5) Review, assess, and monitor the State's expenditure of federal and state COVID-19 relief funds;
- (6) Communicate and disseminate information obtained therefrom; and
- (7) Issue subpoenas; and

Resolves that the current chair and members of the Senate Special Committee on COVID-19 shall also serve on the Senate Special Investigating Committee on COVID-19 in their respective capacities.

Resolves that the Senate Special Investigating Committee on COVID-19 has every power and function allowed to an investigating committee by law, including without limitation the power to:

- (1) Adopt rules for the conduct of its proceedings;
- (2) Issue subpoenas requiring the attendance and testimony of witnesses and subpoenas duces tecum requiring the production of books, documents, records, papers, or other evidence in any matter pending before the investigating committee;
- (3) Hold hearings appropriate for the performance of its duties, at times and places as the investigating committee determines;
- (4) Administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses at hearings of the investigating committee;
- (5) Report or certify instances of contempt as provided in section 21-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes;

- (6) Determine the means by which a record shall be made of its proceedings in which testimony or other evidence is demanded or adduced;
- (7) Provide for the submission, by a witness's own counsel and counsel for another individual or entity about whom the witness has devoted substantial or important portions of the witness's testimony, of written questions to be asked of the witness by the chair; and
- (8) Exercise all other powers specified under chapter 21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and the Rules of the Senate, with respect to an investigating committee.

Resolves that the President of the Senate may from time to time refer for investigation specific matters that are within the scope of the Senate Special Investigating Committee on COVID-19's jurisdiction.

Resolves that the Senate Special Investigating Committee on COVID-19 submit its written findings and recommendations to the Senate prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021 and cease to exist upon the adjournment sine die of the Regular Session of 2021 unless extended.

HAWAIIAN AIRLINES, WALL STREET JOURNAL, RANKINGS OF THE BEST AND WORST AIRLINES IN THE UNITED STATES. Requests the Wall Street Journal to include Hawaiian Airlines in the newspaper's future rankings of the best and worst airlines in the United States.

#### HR 54

SELECT HOUSE COMMITTEE ON COVID-19 ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL PREPAREDNESS. Establishes the Select House Committee on COVID-19 Economic and Financial Preparedness, to work with representatives from local and state government, private industry, and nonprofit agencies and organizations, to inform the House of Representatives on the State's economic and financial preparedness in the event that a COVID-19 outbreak occurs in the State.

Resolves that the Select Committee shall examine economic and financial issues including:

- (1) Identifying the potential economic and financial impact to the State;
- (2) Developing short-term and long-term mitigation plans; and
- (3) Monitoring COVID-19 conditions and outcomes.

Resolves that the Speaker of the House of Representatives appoint the chair and members of the Select Committee.

Resolves that the Select Committee meet and report on a regular basis to the House of Representatives.

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
